Braille Reading: Encouraging the reading of braille texts can make the program more inclusive for visually impaired participants.

Critical Reviews and Analysis: Reading and understanding critical essays or reviews of books, films, art, etc., develops critical thinking and analytical skills.

Magazines, and Journals: Periodicals, including magazines and journals, offer current information and insights on various topics, from science and technology to culture and society. They are useful for keeping up-to-date with trends and developments.

Travel Guides and Brochures: Reading about different places, cultures, and experiences in travel literature can be both informative and inspiring, broadening a reader's understanding of the world.

Government and Legal Documents: Understanding civic documents, laws, and policies promotes civic literacy and informed citizenship.

Online Articles and Blogs: Digital content, when chosen selectively, can offer insightful perspectives, educational content, and current affairs discussions.

Newspapers: Newspapers further broadens the scope of reading materials, catering to those interested in current affairs, journalism, and the socio-political context of the world around them.
